



Disciplinary Procedures/Sanctions

Failure to bring PE Uniform

Pupils not attending in the correct uniform three times in one term will be subject to a PE detention at lunchtime. All failures to bring correct kit are recorded through IRIS. A letter will be sent home for persistent offenders.

As far as possible, uniform will be provided for pupils who fail to bring their own, as we aim to have maximum participation. If this is not possible Students will be asked to make up their lesson time.

Pupils with financial or social difficulties at home will where possible be treated sympathetically. Similarly pupils in Y11 who have genuinely outgrown their uniform will be allowed on occasions to wear alternatives providing that they are plain and as close to school colours as possible.

Non-participation

To be excused from a lesson pupils must in the first week have a written excuse note from home, after which a doctors' note is required. However pupils attending school should expect to take part in PE, generally speaking, if they are healthy enough to be in school then they are considered well enough to participate. Pupils with illness/injury of a minor nature should still bring their uniform, as they may be judged to participate in a limited way in activities, which will not aggravate their problem. In addition to this the Health and Safety Act states that pupils must wear appropriate clothing. Non-participation with a legitimate excuse should be provided with an option, which makes good use of their time and is relevant to PE.

Inappropriate behaviour

Less serious matters can be dealt with by the IRIS system and detaining the pupil at lunchtime or break to discuss and agree future expectations. This includes failure to arrive on time for lessons and behaviour that is disruptive to their own and others learning. Continual failure to behave to the standards expected and more serious incidents may require noting in the pupil's planner. Each member of staff is initially responsible for the discipline of their group, following guidelines in the Staff Handbook. Any issues, which need to be taken further, should be passed to the Heads of PE (see line management in Staff Handbook)

Rewards

Pupils are rewarded for good behaviour, effort or good work according to the guidelines in the Staff Handbook. Pupils can also earn Hall of Fame points by attending extra-curricular clubs and participating in fixtures. The student who gains the most points in a month becomes the student of the month and the top student (boy & girl) at the end of the year receives the trophy. When competing in house events medals and certificates are awarded. As they are, if Students perform well at City of Manchester Sports Partnership events.
