The King David High School believes that our school uniform:

- Is practical and smart
- Promotes a sense of pride in the school
- Helps create a sense of community and belonging towards the school

- Promotes a sense of equality amongst peers
- Helps identify and represent the school

Uniform

General

All pupils are required to wear the standard uniform and must conform to the following rules and guidelines: -

- A navy blue blazer with the school badge, available from School stockists.
- Navy V-necked sweaters are optional. Sweatshirts are not permitted.
- Black shoes in a flat sensible style, no contrasting colours eg. logos/stripes/soles etc.

Boys

- School tie to be worn to the neck at the correct length at all times. Ties are available from the school office.
- Plain grey school trousers to be worn at the waist.
- White school shirt
- Plain, dark coloured socks
- Kippot
- The wearing of Tephillin is encouraged following Bar Mitzvah

Girls

- Skirts must be loose fitting, navy blue with tick pleats front and back, to be worn at knee length at all times. Skirts only available from School stockists.
- Navy stripe open neck blouse with reveres.
- Ankle socks or tights, either must be plain, navy blue or black

Boys' P.E.

- Football boots & shin pads
- Indoor trainers (with soles which do not mark)
- Outdoor trainers
- Navy football socks
- Plain white polo shirt
- Navy shorts
- Badged navy shirt (only available from school stockist)
- Navy blue swimming shorts
- Goggles (optional)
- Towel & toiletries. Spray deodorants are not allowed (shower facilities available)

Girls' P.E.

- Indoor trainers (with soles which do not mark)
- Outdoor trainers
- White socks
- Plain white polo shirt
- Navy blue skorts/navy blue shorts
- School navy blue sports leggings (optional) only available from School stockists
- Plain navy blue Speedo swimming costume only available from School stockists
- School swimming cap (only available from P.E. Department).
- Tracksuit/Sweatshirt (optional) only available from School stockists.
- Goggles (optional)
- Towel & toiletries. Spray deodorants are not allowed (shower facilities available)

It is school policy that students attending lessons without appropriate kit will be issued with clean equipment by the P.E. department.

Personal Appearance

All uniform must be: -

- Clean and in good repair, eg, no jumpers with frayed sleeves, no trousers with ripped hems.
- Worn correctly shirts must be tucked into waistbands, sleeves rolled down and ties should be worn out of shirts in the conventional manner. Top buttons must be kept fastened.

Pupils must ensure that they are always smart in appearance by: -

- Not wearing outdoor coats inside school buildings.
- Not wearing excessive make up
- Never wearing nail varnish or nail extensions.
- Never wearing jewellery this includes chains with Magen David symbols, Chai symbols etc. (There is no religious reason for wearing any jewellery during school times)
- Pupils are permitted one plain stud in each ear lobe. No other piercings are permitted

Any pupil found wearing any item other than permitted jewellery will have it confiscated. The item will be locked in a security cupboard and will be returned on the final day of each half-term.

- Pupils hair must be neat and tidy and well-groomed and off the face.
- No extreme hairstyles or unnatural hair colours

Non Compliance

Pupils, who do not attend school in the correct uniform, will be spoken to by pastoral staff. School will be considerate and attempt to establish why, we are mindful of the variety of reasons a pupil may not be able to attend in the correct uniform. A pupil may be offered a replacement item to borrow if one is available. Alternatively, pupils may be given an opportunity to adhere to the correct uniform within a timeframe. However, in certain circumstances pupils may be sent home to correct the uniform and will be expected to return to school promptly. Pupils may be placed in internal exclusion if there is no other way of rectifying the issue.

Parents and Carers

We ask all parents and carers to support the school uniform policy. Please help reduce misplaced items by clearly labelling uniform with the pupils name.

All school staff are responsible for implementing this policy.
