

## Year 10 Geography Winter Exam Revision List

### Global Development:

You should be able to:

- Describe different definitions of development (economic, social or political focus)
- Describe how and explain why different factors contribute towards the human development of a country (e.g. economic, social, technological, cultural)
- Describe what water and security are and explain why they are so vital for development.
- Describe different methods of measuring development (GDP/capita, HDI, measure of inequality, political corruption etc.)
- Describe variation in global development.
- Explain why this global variation exists (human and physical factors)
- Describe internal variation in development for UK and explain reasons for this.
- Describe various impacts of uneven development on quality of life (e.g. access to housing, healthcare, education, employment, technology, food and water security).
- Describe how uneven development is trying to be addressed (top-down vs. bottom up approaches).
- Use examples to illustrate the strengths and weaknesses of top down and bottom up approaches.

### Case Study – India, a developing/emerging country

- Describe the location of India within its region and globally.
- Describe India's political, social, cultural and environmental context.
- Describe the uneven development within India (core and periphery).
- Explain reasons for this uneven development.
- Describe how India's economy has changed and explain the advantages and disadvantages of these changes.
- Describe how India interacts with the global economy in terms of trade and aid.
- Describe and explain how privatisation has influenced India's economy in more recent years.
- Describe how the Indian population is changing and the impacts (positive and negative) this is having and will have in the future.
- Describe and explain impacts (positive and negative) of changes in technology and geopolitical relationships on India.
- Describe and explain positive and negative impacts of rapid development in India (particularly for people and the environment).
- Describe and explain how negative impacts of rapid population growth are being managed by the Indian government.
